Autism Spectrum Disorder and Gastrointestinal Track Problems

Research has shown that 70% of children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) present with gastrointestinal (GI) problems. These GI issues can include constipation, diarrhea and abdominal pain. The pain associated with these conditions can range from mild to moderate. Most often children with ASD may have a difficult time communicating the pain they are feeling. Not having the tools to communicate their pain can turn into self-injurious behaviors, aggression and irritability. It has been reported that children with ASD have more problems with constipation than their typically developing peers.

Here are some strategies that may help alleviate constipation:

- Gradually introduce more fiber, fruits and veggies
- Introducing prune juice. The complex sugars in this juice cannot be absorbed by the intestine, this helps keep water in the bowel.
- Drink plenty of water
- Add more activity to the child's day.
