Gentleman James

or the past 46 years, James Hubinger has been a part of our Villa family. He is regarded as a gentleman, a man of integrity and an overall great guy. He's kind, caring and friendly. James is respected and admired by those who know him including many lifelong friends and members of the Villa staff. He is not defined by his disabilities, but rather his ability to rise above them or perhaps just dismiss them. James is representative of thousands of individuals with Down syndrome and other intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD) who transcend expectations on a daily basis.

When James was born in 1970, services for individuals with developmental disabilities were just starting to take hold. His parents had the foresight to seek early intervention services and enrolled him in Villa's Infant Center which was the first Special Needs infant facility in the state funded by the Regional Center system. Starting at the age of six months, the center provided the specialized care

and attention that would shape the foundation for his future. James progressed through Villa's preschool program until age seven when he attended Pasadena Public Schools and later, Cal State LA. During this time he was also part of Villa's TREE House (Transitional Residential Educational Experience) Program which promoted the development of basic skills to increase independence while providing weekend respite for families. During his school years, he developed proficiency as an athlete, participating in swimming, powerlifting

and floor hockey through the Special Olympics program.

By the time James was 23, he was on a very typical track for a young man transitioning into adulthood. He moved out of his parent's home and started living full time in one of Villa's family style group homes. Through Villa's Employment Program, James worked at Target and in a variety of positions including Villa's gardening and food service crews. He was actively employed until two years ago when the effects of early onset Parkinsonism prevented him from continuing in the Employment Program, so he transferred into Villa's Dimensions Adult Day Program.

James' path may not seem remarkable except for the fact that individuals with I/DD of his generation were the first to

be recognized for their potential and their right to have the opportunities and support necessary to achieve their goals, live fulfilling lives and embrace a sense of belonging and acceptance.

Throughout his life, James has been surrounded by a wonderful circle of support. His parents raised him with love and respect, and a commitment to giving him every opportunity to live his life fully. They took advantage of emerging programs that fit their son's needs and supported his interests. As James faces new challenges that

come with aging, Villa continues to provide him with services to meet his current needs and fully utilize his capabilities.

One of his passions is sports. Every Sunday at his residential group home, James can be found devouring the sports section. He stays on top of his favorite team, the Cowboys, and tracks their competition. He has a binder at the Dimensions Day Program where he makes notes on all the teams and records player statistics. If you want to talk sports, James is your guy. As a result of Parkinsonism, he can only speak in whispers, but that does not stop him from being heard. Always true to himself, he lives his life without reservation. James is a success story and example to everyone here at Villa. He is a very special individual and just a great guy!

Capital Campaign News

We are on the move and are pleased to provide an update on the progress of our hope *moves* forward Phase I Capital Campaign. This campaign was formally launched in September 2012 with a goal of rebuilding our School campus as well as purchasing and renovating a new space for our Dimensions Adult Day program. Dimensions has been in their new space since January 2016 and loving it. Temporary modular classrooms have been added to the main campus for our middle and high school classes, with our elementary classes moving into the school's main building. The demolition of the old classrooms is now in progress with construction of the 7 new classrooms and multipurpose room starting this spring.

Due to increasing costs of construction we recently increased our Phase I fundraising goal from \$9M to \$11M. We wish to acknowledge and thank Wells Fargo Bank for their generosity. They stepped forward early on in the campaign with a significant \$1M gift and this December added an additional \$100,000 in support of the campaign. We are grateful to Wells for their commitment.

It is with immense excitment and gratitude that we share that close Villa friends have awarded Villa with a transformational gift, bringing our total raised close to \$10M! Their generosity and vision of our new campus is inspiring. This project would not be possible without the help of ALL of our donors!
